



From I-40 and I-540 (near Raleigh-Durham International Airport):

Take I-540 East to Exit 9 and exit south on State Route 50/Creedmoor Road. Follow Creedmoor Road south 2.2 miles to Sawmill Road. Turn left onto Sawmill Road. Springmoor will be on the left.

From I-40 and I-440:

Take I-440 West 12.4 miles, merging onto US-70 West/Glenwood Avenue. Take Exit 7B, State Route 50/Creedmoor Road. Follow Creedmoor Road north

2.8 miles to Sawmill Road. Turn right onto Sawmill Road. Springmoor will be on the left.

From Downtown Raleigh (near North Carolina Museum of Natural Sciences):

Drive north about 5 miles on US-70/Glenwood Avenue. Turn right onto State Route 50N/Creedmoor Road. Follow Creedmoor Road north 2.8 miles to Sawmill Road. Turn right onto Sawmill Road. Springmoor will be on the left.

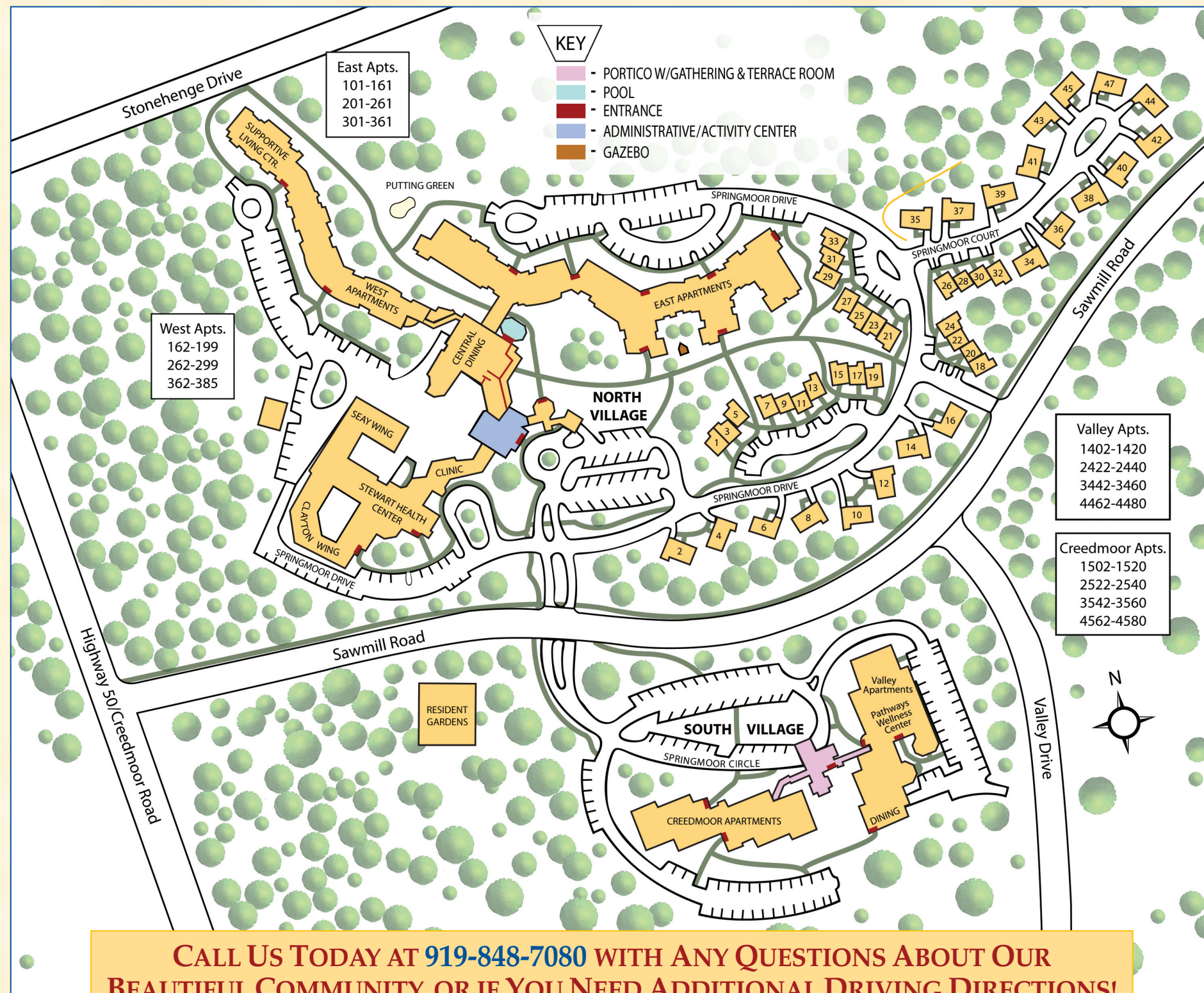
In addition to an abundance of amenities, activities and programs available on the Springmoor campus, Raleigh offers all of the wonderful venues and qualities of a large, established city.

Things to see and do in greater Raleigh Sightseeing and Parks

- **Executive Mansion**—the governor’s home, a grand mansion built in the Queen Anne style of Victorian architecture
- **William B Umstead Park**—offering 5,999 acres that includes hiking and biking trails, 3 manmade lakes and camping areas
- **Historic Oakwood**—scenic neighborhood featuring restored Victorian-style homes
- **Pullen Park**—1st public park in North Carolina, ride carousel, rent pedal boats and includes playground, theater, art and aquatic classes
- **JC Raulston Arboretum**—a nationally acclaimed garden with one of the largest and most diverse collections of landscape plants in the Southeast
- **Raleigh Little Theatre Rose Garden**—scenic garden adjacent to a community theater, with a stunning display of roses

Museums

- **North Carolina Museum of Natural Sciences**—the largest natural history museum in the Southeast features dinosaurs, whale skeletons, live animals, special exhibits and more
- **North Carolina Museum of Art**—one of the leading art museums in the South, ranked among the finest in the nation

- **North Carolina Museum of History**—exhibits highlight the state’s military history, decorative arts, sports heroes and more
- **Joel Lane Museum House**—built circa 1769, this jewel of Georgian architecture was fully restored and furnished in the 1970s, and is open for tours led by costumed docents

Performing Arts

- **North Carolina Symphony**—founded in 1932, offering 175 performances annually across the state, and the first state-supported symphony in the country
- **Carolina Ballet**—launched as a professional dance company in 1997, this ballet has garnered critical praise from media, and has staged 80 world premiere ballets
- **Duke Energy Center for the Performing Arts**—a magnificent performing arts facility offering entertainment in five specialized venues
- **North Carolina Opera**—presents wide range of operatic performances
- **PineCone**—presents traditional music, dance and other folk performing arts
- **PNC Arena**—home to the NHL’s Carolina Hurricanes and NC State University men’s basketball hosts more than 150 events and shows each year

Sports

- **Carolina Hurricanes**—professional ice hockey at PNC Arena
- **North Carolina State**—college football, with home games at Carter-Finley Stadium
- **NCFC**—professional soccer team competes in the USL, with home matches at WakeMed Soccer Park
